He refused to divulge the contents, saying that it was merely a letter of farewell. He said the woman had been sick and out of work for a long time, and that was the only reason there could be for suicide.

THE TRIAL OF MATTHEW STAPLETON FOR MANSLAUGHTER

Court of Sessions--Judge Moore, and Justices Johnson and Stillwell

On the night of the Fourth of July last a boy named Daniel Desmond was walking along State street with two or three companions, and when near Boerum street, while in conversation, they came near two young men, one of whom was standing up and the other was in the act of relieving himself. In reply to a question put to Desmond by one of his friends, one of these strangers, as testified, made a filthy remark, upon which Desmond said, "What the h-ll are you saying?" Thereupon the stranger, who was standing up, advanced upon Desmond and struck him a blow, which knocked Desmond down. Desmond was taken home, and the next day he died. It did not appear that Desmond had been struck with anything more than a man's fist.

This morning Matthew Stapleton, one of the drivers for Dodd's express, was placed on trial charged with having struck the blow that killed Desmond. On that night Stapleton was roaming about the streets with a young companion named McIntire. The main evidence to identify Stapleton as the man who struck the blow was the evidence of a boy about fifteen years of age, named John Murphy. He positively identified him this morning, but upon cross examination it was shown that before the Coroner, he had said that Michael Smith had done it, and then that Stapleton had done it. It was also shown by his own confession that, young as he was, he had been arrested ten times and had been in the penitentiary. Case still on.

JAMES DESMOND IS DEAD AT 59; POLITICAL WRITER FOR DAILY NEWS
COLUMNIST WROTE BIOGRAPHY OF ROCKEFELLER--SERIES ON TAXES WON AWARD

James Desmond, a political writer for The Daily News, died of cancer yesterday in Mount Sinai Hospital. He was 59 years old. Formerly a resident of Bedford Hills, N. Y., he had lived at the Tudor Hotel since the death of his wife two years ago.

Governor Rockefeller, the subject of a biography by Mr. Desmond that was published in 1964, issued the following statement on his death: "The loss is a heavy one to all of us in and out of government who knew him. His insight, his integrity and his ability made him one of our nation's most respected journalists. Mrs. Rockefeller and myself

treasured his friendship. We both express our deepest sympathy to his family."

The tall, slender, convivial Mr. Desmond was a specialist in state political affairs. His column of analysis and comment, "Albany Line," appeared regularly in The Sunday News.

Since 1944 he had covered every national political convention and except for his illness would have been accompanying Governor Rockefeller on the campaign trail.

In 1952 he and Joseph Martin received a George Polk Memorial Award for a series in The News that led to the payment by the Treasury of \$10-million in unclaimed refunds to taxpayers.

"Nelson Rockefeller: A Political Biography," was praised in The New York Times as "a friendly and understanding work that clearly reflects Mr. Desmond's wide understanding of professional politics, how nominations are won and lost and how Rockefeller won one and lost another."

Mr. Desmond was born in Brooklyn on Aug. 24, 1908, and grew up in Yonkers, where he joined The Yonkers Statesman in 1930. He later worked for The Associated Press, The New York World Telegram and PM. He joined The News during World War II.

Surviving are a son, Michael of New York; a daughter, Mrs. Sheila D. Schultz of Oroville, Calif.; a brother, John W. Desmond, assistant Sunday editor of The Times; a sister, Mrs. Walter Fitzpatrick of Las Vegas, Nev., and 10 grandchildren-.

FOUND DEAD IN HER HOME

POLICE INVESTIGATE DEATH OF JOHANNA DESMOND, 80 YEARS, AND FIND IT WAS FROM NATURAL CAUSES A sudden death, which at first appeared to have some mysterious features, occurred during the night at 1 Paige ct. and was investigated by the police of division 1 under the direction of Capt. Kimball.

Johanna Desmond, a single woman, 80 years old, who was an old resident of the North End district, and who had lived for a number of years at 1 Paige ct., was found dead on the floor near her bed this morning, her head resting in a quantity of blood which had come from the side of her throat.

The police were notified, and Capt. Kimball sent men to the house to make an investigation. In turn, they called on the health department, and a physician was sent to examine the body. The examination of the latter, and what the police learned, convinced them that the death had resulted from natural causes.

Miss Desmond had been an invalid for some months, and had been attended by Dr. Freedman of a North End dispensary. She also had a nurse who came in daytimes. When the nurse visited the room this morning, she found the old woman dead on the floor by the side of the bed. Miss Desmond probably died suddenly in the night, and in her death struggles fell out on the floor. She had a sore on her throat, which accounted for the blood under her head.

Dr. Freedman certified to the cause of death, and so the medical examiner was not notified and the police dropped the case.

Miss Desmond lived with her nephew, Edward J. Desmond, a longshoreman.

Desmond had placed a roll of bills amounting to \$300 and a diamond ring on a table. He was a member of the New York Bar Association, was 40 years old and was unmarried.

MURDER CHARGE

DRUNKEN ORGY IN HUT

An inquiry into the death of Michael Desmond, aged 50, which occurred following a drunken orgy in a hut at National Park on April 26, was opened by the City Coroner (Mr E. A. May) on Friday. Thomas Jenkins, who has been arrested on a charge of murder was present at the proceedings.

Sergeant McNeill said that he found Desmond lying dead on a bed in the hut. There was a bottle which had contained methylated [sic] spirits on the floor, while on a stretcher was an intoxicated woman. Outside the hut witness found another woman who was drunk. On the Thursday prior to his death Desmond had been locked up for riotous behaviour. He was a violent man when under the influence of drink.

Detective Keeble said when he questioned Jenkins, the latter admitted having killed Desmond, but declared he had acted in self-defence. Jenkins, said witness, indicated a piece of wood with which Desmond had attacked him.

Sarah Smith said that after Desmond entered the hut methylated spirits was consumed, and later wine was drunk. Desmond and Jenkins later became involved in an argument and then she heard someone calling to her that Desmond was dead. The Coroner found that Desmond died from a wound in the throat and committed Jenkins for trial on a charge of murder.

MICHAEL DESMOND, 64, TEACHING WAS A 'CALLING'

Michael Desmond had wanted to be a lawyer like his father and two brothers, but life kept steering him to be a teacher, a vocation that turned out to be a true calling for him. "People come up to me all the time and ask if I'm related to the teacher, Michael Desmond," said his wife, Peggy, "Then they go on to tell me about the wonderful time they had in his class. Teaching really was a calling with him."

Mr. Desmond died at home Tuesday of a heart attack at age 64. Since 1998, when he suffered a stroke, he had been working part time training teachers at Christian Brothers High School, where he taught history for the last 11 years of his 30-year classroom career, his wife said. Earlier, he had taught at Jonas Salk Middle School and Bishop Manogue High School. "He had an absolute passion for history, any history. He traced his family's history way back. He liked to tell of one great-great-grandmother who came on the boat from Ireland" and made her way to Marysville, "then walked to Grass Valley," she said. "He gave me a lesson on the history of the Portuguese National Church the day he died."

Equal with his love of history, Mr. Desmond was a gregarious man who loved corny jokes, his wife said. "He was very people oriented, and he used humor to connect with his students," she said. "And he was also a die-hard fan of Christian Brothers athletics, as well as a man of deep faith, involved in all the Catholic activities."

Mr. Desmond was born May 1, 1937, to Edna Nicolaus and Earl D. Desmond, both descendants of Gold Rush pioneers. She was the daughter of Louis Nicolaus, a founder of Sacramento's old Buffalo Brewery at 21st and Q streets.

Mr. Desmond graduated from Christian Brothers in 1956, then attended seminary in Oregon before graduating from Seattle University. Later, he was awarded his teaching credential at Gonzaga University and a master's at the University of San Francisco.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by daughters Kerry Desmond of Kansas City, Mo., Katie Desmond of Flagstaff, Ariz., and Colleen Desmond of Washington, D.C.; a son, David Desmond of Pasadena; and brothers Richard and Louis and sisters Mary Mastalski, Denise Franzoia and Clare Lagomarsino, all of Sacramento.

THE MURDER OF TERRANCE DESMOND.

On the 24:th of June, 1880, coroner Nichols received a telegram from A. A. Cady, sent from Chatfield, stating that the dead body of Terrance Desmond, a farmer and former resident of the town of Elmira, had been found in a grove on his farm, in a condition showing that the man had been murdered. Deputy-coroner Benjamin left immediately for the place designated, and took prompt measures toward holding an inquest over the remains of the deceased.

A coroner's jury was duly summoned and several witnesses were examined, when the following-named facts were elicited: Mr. Desmond was seen alive for the last time on the afternoon of Wednesday, June 23, about four o'clock. There were various conjectures respecting his sudden and mysterious disappearance, and a search for him was instituted. His scythe, which he had been using to cut weeds, was found hanging in a tree. Search was made in the immediate vicinity, but not finding the missing man, some of the party went to a field of sugar-cane where the deceased had also been at work on the afternoon of his disappearance. The body was found about twenty rods west of the cane field, and close by the remains there was a spot in the grass and weeds where it was evident that some person had been recently sitting down. Deceased was lying .on the face, with his right hand under him and his hat directly in front of him at a spot just where he had evidently come out of the thick brush into the path. The blood from his wounds had run down the hill and his clothing was saturated with blood from head to feet. His throat had been cut from ear to ear. The gash was fully seven inches in length and severed the jugular vein and the windpipe. There was another cut just below the one first mentioned, and there were also two stabs over the left ear and one behind the ear. The skull was mashed in directly above the ear. About two rods from the body a heavy seasoned oak club, some five or six feet in length, upon which were bloody spots and hair, was found.

Mrs. Ellen Desmond, wife of the murdered man, testified that her late husband was last seen at four o'clock Wednesday afternoon, when he came down to the house from the field to look after some colts. She stated that her husband was in a hurry, saying that he must return to the field at once to finish some work before it was time to attend to the chores. Mrs. Desmond also said that there had been hard feelings between her husband and Edwin Reynolds, a brother-in-law and neighbor of the deceased, but she did not think the enmity so great as to provoke murder. The jury returned a verdict that Mr. Desmond came to his death by a blow from a club upon the head and by his throat being cut by some person to them unknown.

Charles Van Allen, a boy eighteen years of age, and who was at work for Mr. Desmond at the time of the murder, was arrested on suspicion of having committed the bloody deed, brought to Rochester by sheriff White and lodged in jail.

On the 27th of July Van Allen had an examination, conducted by county-attorney Eckholdt, before Justice Laird, at Chatfield, on the charge of murder. The hearing commenced at one o'clock in the afternoon and lasted until three o'clock the following morning. Over thirty witnesses were examined, but the evidence not being deemed sufficient to warrant the court in holding the accused, he was discharged.

Edwin Reynolds, before spoken of, and who was present at the examination of Van Allen, was immediately arrested by sheriff White on a warrant issued by Justice Laird and made returnable before Justice S. W. Eaton at Rochester. Reynolds was brought before Justice Eaton on Thursday, the 28th, when an adjournment was had till nine o'clock the next morning. C. Kingley, Esq., of Chatfield, and R. A.

Jones, Esq., of Rochester, appeared for the defense; the state was represented by county-attorney Eckholdt. The examination lasted two days, twenty-five witnesses having been examined. The testimony in the case on the part of the state was that Reynolds and deceased had for some time past been at great enmity with one another; that a few weeks previously the two had had a fight; that Reynolds had bitten Desmond's face pretty badly in the fight, though the former got soundly whipped at last; that Reynolds subsequently prosecuted deceased for an assault, lost his case and had to pay the costs of suit, amounting to about \$20. Several of the witnesses testified that Reynolds was of an ugly, quarrelsome nature, and that he had frequently been heard to say that he would "make away with Desmond before long." The examination resulted in the accused being held to await the action of the grand jury at the following December term of the district court.

The court convened on December 6, Hon. William Mitchell presiding. The grand jury found an indictment against Reynolds for the willful murder of Terrance Desmond. On being arraigned and required to plead to the indictment, Reynolds plead not guilty. On Wednesday, the second week of the session, the case of the State V. Reynolds was called, county-attorney Eckholdt being assisted by attorney-general Start, on the part of the state. After some delay a jury was impaneled and the trial proceeded.

The case was given to the jury Thursday afternoon, and after being out about twenty hours, they returned into court and informed the judge that they were unable to agree upon a verdict. It was understood that the final vote stood eleven for acquittal and one for conviction. Judge Mitchell required Reynolds to give bail in the sum of \$2,000 for his appearance at the next term of court, but in default of bail he was kept in jail until March 18, 1881, when he was released on his own recognizance, and on August 6 following, Judge Start, successor of Judge Mitchell on the bench, ordered the action dismissed. --History of Winona and Olmstead Counties [Minnesota] (Chicago: H. TIMOTHY DESMOND

Timothy Desmond, a well known resident of Brooklyn, and a Democratic politician of prominence, died on Saturday at his home, No. 417 Clermont avenue. The immediate cause of death was an affection of the liver. Mr. Desmond had been ailing for some time, but was able to be about as usual up to within a few weeks of his death. Deceased was 50 years of age and a native of Troy, N.Y., but had lived in Brooklyn for a quarter of a century or more. He always took a deep interest in local politics, and was for years a member of the regular Democratic organization. He left it temporarily to join the Jeffersonian Committee, an independent Democratic organization which had a brief and inglorious existence here some years ago. Mr. Desmond did not seem to take that interest in it that he evinced in the affairs of the regular organization, to which he promptly returned upon the dissolution of the Jeffersonians. He had considerable ambition in the direction of office, and sought nominations for several offices, but without success. One of the causes of his failure was his inability to conciliate the rival party leaders in his ward,

the Twentieth. Mr. Desmond always took an active part in the affairs of the regular committee as long as he was a member, and while he did not always agree with the more prominent men of the party here, credit was given to him for the belief that he was acting according to his sense of what was right and proper. He was very strong in his likes and dislikes, and never hesitated to express his opinions when he felt called upon to do so. In campaign times he did good services for the party, both by work outside and inside, at public meetings and in the business of the committee. He was a faithful friend, and the announcement of his death was received with deep regret by a large circle of acquaintances.

Mr. Desmond was formerly in the business of butcher, and in 1870 retired from it a comparatively rich man. He subsequently engaged in the coal business, which he continued up to the time of his death. This last venture did not prove successful, and he found his property gradually slipping away from him. Deceased was married, and left several children. One of his daughters is the wife of Supervisor Murphy of the Ninth Ward. The funeral services will be held at the Cathedral Chapel, Clermont avenue
