Introduction
by Humphrey J. Desmond¹

BANDON is a town of some six thousand inhabitants located twenty miles west of Cork. It is in that position of the former domains of the Earls of Desmond that was granted to Court favorites, who, however, did not hold it long. by the year 1602 these lands came into the possession of Boyle, Earl of Cork, who sought to substitute English colonists in place of the Irish inhabitants, and who in the process founded the unprepossessing town of Bandon. A farmland or ploughland district adjacent to Bandon is known as Gurteen. Here, about the year 1750, lived Patrick Desmond. He was grandfather of Thomas Desmond (1833-1901), in whose memory these pages are written.

So far as family traditions go we cannot trace our ancestry further back than 1750. There may (though I doubt it) be records extant in Ireland which might enable us reliably to date our family history from 1700 or 1650. This may be worth investigation later. For the present I pass on.

Patrick Desmond was twice married. The maiden name of his first wife was Brennan. I am unable to ascertain the name of his second wife. He left surviving him ten sons. By his first marriage there were five sons and two daughters. The sons were: (1) Dennis, (2) Patrick, (3) Cornelius, (4) John, and (5) Humphrey. (1) Dennis died in Ireland, but his widow and two sons, John and Cornelius, came to America. My uncle Dennis met them at Utica, N. Y., in 1837. John subsequently moved to Port Huron, Mich. (a place that was once known as "Desmond"). My uncle had a letter from him about the year 1858. (2, 3) Of Patrick and Cornelius, brothers of Dennis, I have learned nothing. (4) John remained in Ireland. I met one of his sons in 1896. This was Patrick Desmond of Bandon, born in 1814; and his account of the family was substantially identical with our traditions. (5) The fifth son, Humphrey Desmond, was the father of Thomas Desmond, the subject of this memoir. Of him, later.

By the second marriage of Patrick Desmond there were five sons: (1) Timothy, (2) Mathew, (3) Daniel, (4) Bartholomew, and (5) William. Daniel settled at Brasher Falls, N.Y. Bartholomew and William settled at Utica, N.Y. Descendants of Daniel now reside in La Crosse and in Allamakee county, Ia. Descendants of Bartholomew still reside at Utica, N. Y. William left no descendants.

Patrick Desmond (1750), with whom this sketch starts, had several brothers. My uncle Dennis, in a letter dated Sept. 13, 1900, wrote me: "Patrick Desmond, who died in Cedarburg, was a first cousin to my father. Cornelius Desmond, who died in Utica, N. Y. was also a first cousin. My father had several cousins in Boston and in Fall River, Mass."

Humphrey Desmond [son of Patrick] was born in 1782. In his thirty second year (1814) he married Dorothy Allen, then nineteen years of age. They were married in the parish church at Neucestown, now Bandon. she was of a Protestant family and was baptized in the Episcopalian church. but her mother became a Catholic while Dorothy Allen was a child.

I find this passage in a letter my father wrote me in 1896 while I was in Europe: "Mother had two brothers, Thomas and John, after one of whom I was named. She had a sister, Lucy, and possibly other sisters. Her mother became a convert to the Catholic church when she was but a year old, but I understand her father died in the Church of England."

Bandon and its vicinity was notoriously plagued with sectarian feuds. Humphrey Desmond belonged to the secret society known as the "Whiteboys," organized to defend the rights of his class.

In 1829 he came to America, crossing the ocean in nine weeks, and bringing with him his wife and five children, ranging in age from twelve to two years. He was then in his forty-seventh year. He landed at Quebec, and shortly after moved to Kingston Mills, near Kingston Ontario. Here he lived four years and here, October 14, 1833, his youngest son, Thomas Desmond was born.

The next year (1834) the family moved to Utica, N. Y., and in 1835 they settled at Little Falls, in Herkimer county. The building of a railroad and the enlargement of the Erie canal attracted many settlers to this vicinity. Here my father spent his childhood years and here two of his sisters, Julia and Mary, were married--the first to Edward Sweeney and the second (Mary) to Simon McGrath, who planned to make his home in the great West.

This circumstance may have determined the subsequent migration of our family, but it is also quite likely that settlement on the rich lands of the West was the original plan of Humphrey Desmond. At any rate he purchase one hundred and sixty acres of land in Ozaukee county, Wisconsin, paying the Government twelve shillings an acre therefor in gold. and in 1842 the family began its journey westward over the great lakes from Buffalo. Milwaukee was reached August 29, 1842.

Humphrey Desmond was then sixty years of age. He was a man of superior education and, from what I can learn, of considerable force of character. His decision in his sixtieth year to venture into what was then known as the far West in order to found a home for his family was no mediocre act. In this, of course, he was assisted by his wife, a most capable woman, and by a growing family. Three sons--Dennis, aged nineteen; Patrick, aged twelve, and Thomas, aged nine, and a daughter, Elizabeth, aged fifteen, made up the pioneer household. A daughter, Mary (Mrs. Simon McGrath), was settled a few miles distant on a farm. The oldest daughter, Julia, now the wife of Edward Sweeney, remained in New York, and the oldest son, John, then twenty-one, remained in Utica.

On April 6, 1856, Thomas Desmond and Johanna Bowe were married. She was then about twenty-two years of age. She had come from Ireland with her father, a brother and a younger sister in 1847 and after some years in Buffalo, where her father died, she came west to Wisconsin to visit two uncles, John and Jeremiah Bowe, then settled on farms in the vicinity of the Desmonds.

For ten years (1856-66) my father resided on the farm originally cleared by the family. It was located in the town of Mequon, Ozaukee county, a mile and a half from Cedarburg, then a little village, now a small city reached by the Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul railway, about an hour's ride north of Milwaukee. The frame house where he lived and a very good barn which he built in 1853 still stand. During most of the winters he taught district school. His chief occupation, of course, was that of farming.

On an adjacent farm lived his brother Dennis, between whom and himself there was always a strong feeling of companionship and mutual confidence. The older brother, John Desmond, had come West after 1852 and gone into the hardware business at Port Washington. Two of my father's sisters, Mrs. Mary McGrath and Mrs. Jeremiah Bowe, were settled on farms four or five miles distant, and a brother, Patrick Desmond [brother of Thomas] also married, had gone to the front in the Army of the Cumberland.

Ozaukee county was in those days (as it is today) very strongly Democratic. There was opposition to the war. My father and his brother Dennis were "war Democrats," differing from their neighbors herein. The older brother, John Desmond, was a Republican and at one time the nominee of his party in Ozaukee county for State Senator.

About the Descendancy

The following descendancy was compiled from newspaper articles, obituaries, mortuary, cemetery, church, birth, death, marriage, and census records, various other records, personal interviews, and Humphrey J. Desmond's *A Memoir of Thomas Desmond* (op. cit.). It is the result of hundreds of hours of research. The original pedigree that was published on this website has been revised based upon additional research and completely reformatted.

The existence of the Michigan branch of this family is based upon the following passage from Humphrey J. Desmonds *Memoir*: "Dennis died in Ireland but his widow and two sons, John and Cornelius, came to America, My uncle Dennis met them at Utica, N.Y., in 1837. John subsequently moved to Port Huron, Mich. (a place that was once known as "Desmond"). My uncle had a letter from him about the year 1858." The only John Desmond in Port Huron in the U.S. censuses is the John Desmond listed with his family in the pedigree. He is found in both the 1860 and 1870 censuses. He is listed in the Michigan Death Index as having died in Port Huron on 1 Dec 1877, but the names of his parents are given as "John" and "Catherine." No John Desmond with these parents is to be found in the existing Catholic parish records. There is, however, a John Desmond born to Dennis Desmond and Mary O'Cullinane, who was baptized at Bandon on 17 Dec 1818 (<http://churchrecords.irishgenealogy.ie/churchrecords>).

In the enlarged edition of his *History of Bandon*, George Bennett mentions an Irish rebel, Dr. Desmond, who lived outside the wall of Bandon in 1641.² He is the first Desmond in the area of Bandon of whom we have a record. How long there had been Desmonds residing there we have no way of knowing, since all record of them was either lost or destroyed because of the nearly continual warfare in the area beginning with the First Desmond Rebellion (1569-1573) and continuing through the Nine Years War (1594-1603). We do know that there were less than ten Desmond families in the entire barony of Kinalmeaky, which includes Bandon in 1659 because *Desmond* is not listed as a principal surname there by Petty in the 1659 census. It seems possible, therefore, that all of the Desmond families residing in the immediate area of Bandon before 1750 may have been closely related, being descendants of a few Desmonds who were either living in the area when the town was founded in 1604 or who migrated to the area shortly thereafter. I have come across records of many other Desmonds, both in the U.S. and Ireland, in my research who seem to belong somewhere in this descendancy. I am, however, unable to connect them because the names of the brothers of Patrick Desmond of Gurteen are not known.

I realize that there may be mistakes and omissions in the descendancy and would be grateful for any corrections or additions. Additional information has been added and major revisions made in 2015. I am not directly related to anyone in this family, but owe much of my inspiration in genealogy to Humphrey J. Desmond's chapter on the Earls of Desmond in his *Memoir*. I have, also, spent many entertaining and informative hours reading his other books. He was constantly in my thoughts as I compiled this descendancy of his family.

Note

The numbering system and format of the descendency are straightforward and may be understood intuitively. Family relationships are indicated by the position of a person's name. A minimum of genealogical symbols and abbreviations are used. Each individual is assigned a unique number in the descendency depending upon the generation to which he or she belongs and order of birth among his or her siblings. Spouses are assigned the next successive number following that of the person to whom they are married in the chronological order of their marriage. Any individual can be readily identified by his or her unique number. Additional information for many individuals is provided in the notes. The paragraphing of quotations from newspaper articles in the notes has been altered to conserve space. The abbreviations and symbols used in the chart are as follows:

Dennis Desmond came to Webster City about three weeks ago for a visit with his brother. He had been feeling bad for two weeks prior, but did not know his ailment. He consulted with Sioux City physicians, but they were uncertain as to his trouble. He displayed symptoms of typhoid, but no certainty existed as to whether this was his real trouble. Upon his arrival here, however, the symptoms were unmistakable to his brother. He knew the minute he saw him that he was afflicted with typhoid. He was taken to the hospital at once where he was given every attention and aid that could possibly benefit him. From having been about upon his feet for at least two weeks after being taken with the disease, his case developed into what Dr. Desmond characterizes as the worst one he ever saw. The aid of other Webster City doctors was called in and the patient was given the benefit of everything that could be done. It was of no use, however. He sank slowly but none the less steadily and for several days his demise had been momentarily expected. Last week the children were called, when some of them took farewell leave of their brother. The mother was with him when death came. Beside the mother, two brothers and three sisters survive. Dennis Desmond was not well known in this city. While residing in Canada, Humphrey Desmond had purchased 60 acres of land in Ozaukee county, Wisconsin, and in 1842, the family made its way there by wagon, accompanied by daughter Mary and her husband, Simon McGrath. By then the family consisted of three sons and a daughter: Dennis, aged nineteen; Patrick, aged twelve; Thomas, aged nine; and Elizabeth, aged fifteen. Two of the older children, Julia and John, had stayed in New York. They cleared the land and started a farm, and it was there that Thomas grew up.

On April 6, 1856, Thomas married Johanna Bowe, who was then about 21 years old. They lived on the family farm, which was located near Mequon, just outside of Cedarburg for about ten years, and Thomas taught at the district school. In 1866, they moved, with their three children, to Milwaukee, where Thomas found work as a clerk for the public school board. From 1866 to 1880 he served as head of the school board. In 1881, Thomas became state manager for the Connecticut Mutual Life Insurance Company, a position which he held until his death in 1901. ⁷² Humphrey Joseph Desmond, author, publisher, lawyer, and political reformer, was born on September 14, 1858 outside Cedarburg, Wisconsin. He was the eldest son of Thomas and Johanna Bowe Desmond.

In 1880, he graduated from the University of Wisconsin in 1880 with a B.L. and set up a law practice in Milwaukee in 1881 and was regarded by his associates as one of the finest lawyers in the Wisconsin bar. He served on the Milwaukee School Board from 1883 to 1890 and was a member of the Wisconsin state legislature from 1890 to 1891.

In 1891, Mr. Desmond became editor of the *Catholic Citizen*, a Catholic newspaper published in Milwaukee. He eventually became owner and acquired ownership of other Catholic newspapers in Washington, D. C., Memphis, Tennessee, and St. Paul, Minnesota. He was the first president of the Irish-American Association and wrote many articles exposing the oppression of Catholics in the U.S. Many of his articles were published in *The North American Review*, *The Forum*, *"The Century"*, and other magazines. He was, also, a special contributor to *The Library of the World's Best Literature* and *The Catholic Encyclopedia*.

He was the author of many books on history and ecclesiastical law, including *Curious Chapters of American History*, *Mooted Questions of History*, *The Church and the Law*, *The A.P.A. Movement*, *The Know-Nothing Party*, and *Why God Loves the Irish*. In 1905, he published his tribute to his father, *A Memoir of Thomas Desmond*, a biography.

Mr. Desmond married Susan Ryan in Milwaukee. They had six children: Dorothy Louise, Humphrey Earl, Katharine Grace, Marion E., Thomas E., and John Desmond. Following his death in 1932, his son Humphrey Earl Desmond succeeded him as editor and publisher of *The Catholic Citizen*.
